

Clarence Integrated Care Centre (ICC) Project – Update April 2009

Governance

John Ramsay & Associates have completed and submitted their interim governance report and recommendations.

Under the terms of the funding agreement the Commonwealth will now consider the proposed governance arrangements for the GP Super Clinic.

Service model

Lorraine Millar has convened regular meetings with Royal Hobart Hospital (RHH) staff covering ambulatory care, specialist clinics, chronic disease and pharmacy.

These meetings will identify those services currently provided at the RHH that may be more appropriately provided at the ICC.

These groups will consider clinical pathways, staffing numbers and types of staff, and from where staff could be drawn.

Peter Lorraine will convene a similar group across Primary Care with representation from the RHH to draw the two processes together.

Architects and user group workshops

Architects Forward Brianese continue to hold fortnightly workshops with project user group representatives to better understand each service area's design needs for the Clarence ICC/GP Super Clinic.

The first conceptual schematic design drawings are now completed and will be sent out to stakeholders in the near future.

Following sign off of the conceptual schematic design drawings, we will move into the design development phase in consultation with project user group members.

This process will ensure that the fit-out of the internal spaces meets the needs of the target population.

We will look to engage the Clarence City Council in the next month or so to progress car parking requirements, the traffic impact of the new development and the urban planning interface with Council.
